



DESTRA ADIGE LAGARINA

"Destra Adige Lagarina" Paesaggi e tradizioni, Natura e Cultura lungo il filo rosso dell'antica strada

Il progetto, sostenuto dalla Provincia Autonoma di Trento, di valorizzazione del paesaggio collinare al fine di potenziare il locale distretto agro-turistico-ambientale, ha posto come priorità la riqualificazione della viabilità storica di collegamento fra Isera, Nogarredo, Villa Lagarina, Pomarolo e Nomi. Ciò ha consentito di recuperare tratti di muro a secco, di strada e insieme a loro scorci di storia, che raccontano della fruizione passata di queste zone.

Along the ancient road...

The priority of the regional project to develop the area to the right of the River Adige is the redevelopment of the ancient road that connects Isera, Nogarredo, Villa Lagarina, Pomarolo and Nomi. As part of the project, stretches of the dry stone walls and the road itself have been restored.

Isera

In the XVIII century the local nobility built some splendid palaces in Isera and there are some impressive late-Baroque buildings. Churches include S. Vincenzo and the medieval Church of S. Martino. Due to its hillside position Isera made a

good place for a settlement and archeological evidence dates back to prehistoric and Neolithic times. In Roman times the settlement expanded and a Roman Villa was built overlooking the valley. The remains of the medieval fortresses of Castel Corno and Castel Pradaglia can still be visited today. The "Pisa Vaca" waterfall has a rocky wall with large pot-holes created by erosion. There are 1,000 species of flora including 67 at risk of extinction. Endangered species of fauna can be found in the fields of Bordala and there

are amphibians in the wetlands. In the Adige Valley nature site wrynecks and numerous migratory passerines can be seen and in winter there are herons and cormorants. There are also various birds of prey in the area and brown bears have been spotted recently.

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
